- 1. Please email me to confirm receipt of this assignment: sfinkler@fcapatriots.org
- 2. Search online to find the article "How to Mark a Book" by Mortimer J. Adler, Ph.D. Print the article and read it, highlighting and annotating throughout.
- 3. Purchase the book *Lord of the Flies* by William Golding. You will need a print edition of this novel, no e-books for this assignment. Also, since you will be writing in the book and using it throughout the course, I advise against borrowing a copy.
- 4. Read and annotate Golding's book, following the guidelines in Adler's article. I should see evidence of your reading and annotation on the pages of your book. Some students also use post-it notes for longer notes or annotation; that is optional. I should see strong evidence that you have interacted with this text by looking through the pages of your book.
- 5. You have no further written assignment for *Lord of the Flies* at this time, but be prepared to be tested on the novel soon after school resumes in August. We will use this novel as our first unit of study to prepare for the AP Lit exam and college reading and writing.
- 6. Finally, you need to begin a section of notes on names, places, and events that may appear in literature we read for the course or on the AP exam. Use notebook paper to list the names, places, and events and write brief definitions or identifiers for each. Use your own words; no need to copy long definitions or passages. These should be handwritten and will be used and added to throughout the course. Eventually we will have several lists, but over the summer please begin two lists: **Biblical** and **Mythological** (to identify these items, use your Bible, a mythology book such as Edith Hamilton's, a general reference book, or a reliable internet source.)
